Hope you all had a good Thanksgiving break and a good start to this year.

Our annual assurance reviews begin in late October for central departments (finance, transportation, and facilities) and are scheduled in November for schools.

In October, trustees were assigned to one of the board committees, the committee of school councils (COSC) Alberta school board association zone 2/3, board policies, audit committee, advocacy committee, teacher's collective bargaining and expulsion committee. Each trustee is on 2 or 3 committees. This year I will be on the expulsion committee and the advocacy committee.

Over the summer facilities completed 377 projects, an average of almost 10 per school. Major projects included the first phase of the Salisbury storm water.

Repair and the FR Haythorne roof and building envelop. Other projects were renovation and upgrades to Quiet rooms, parking lot line re-painting, annual fire alarm System, gym floor refinishing.

School visits continue again this year. And we will be visiting Fort Saskatchewan schools next Tuesday, the 17th of October.

The monthly public board meeting will be on the 19th of October with the agenda and all items to be discussed and decided on the EIPS.ca website by Monday noon.One item that will take much discussion and wisdom is the French immersion location for junior high and high school.

Meet the teacher night with the BBQ was a huge success. We now have 459 students enrolled in our school.

This is due to the capacity the church holds and also allows the LOGOS program to dive deeper into their faith for the concert. During the day on the 7<sup>th</sup> the kids will be bussed over to the Church to have rehearsals.

The school is needing 4 volunteers for the Christmas concert to man doors and handle the donation basket. The donations will go back to the school to help with the cost of renting out the church. The cost to rent the Church was \$1200.00.

There will be an insurance review happening at Brentwood this year. This will involve three other schools and some school board officials. We will have the data that comes from this review at our next meeting.

One new full time educational assistant has been hired and we are looking to hire one more.

There is an increase of parents coming in through side doors to talk to teacher when there is no appointment booked. We need to make sure that parents are booking a time to talk to the teachers and then are coming in through the front doors, so that all visitors are documented coming in and leaving the school.

Tuesday Oct 1 the kids will be able to dress up in their costumes. There will be a parade happening this year!

SCHOOL COUNCIL ENGAGEMENT GRANT

Alberta Education is providing school councils with a \$500 School Council Engagement Grant. Those

school councils interested in accessing funding must meet grant criteria, which essentially means

opportunities that help build capacity and strengthen engagement. To administer the 2023-24 grant,

EIPS first needs to collect contact information from school councils in the Division. Have one member

from your school council complete this contact form by Monday, October 23. More information about

applying for the grant will be shared in the November COSC meeting package.

#### EIPS THREE-YEAR ENGAGEMENT PLAN
